4. Show Reports

a. Porterhouse Blue (Week 3 ADC Main – Katherine Ridley)

S – 30%, publicity will kick in soon.

- P One set designer has dropped out but the remaining set designer seems fine with that. A composer has also dropped out, no replacement has been found so they have cut down on the amount of music that will be composed for the show.
- A Rehearsals are starting this week.
- T Set designs are coming together and the TD will be able to start ordering and construction soon. Main concern at the moment is getting enough painters onboard.

b. Pomona (Week 4 Corpus Main – Adam Mirsky)

- S 3%, publicity will kick in soon.
- P Full team, budget has been confirmed and their first prod team meeting is next week.
- A Fully cast, read through is on Monday, and rehearsals are scheduled.
- T Tech team is complete. Cubes are being hired for the set.

c. Wander (Week 5 ADC Main – Sophie Taylor)

5. Freshers' Shows Evaluation

Theo Heymann created a feedback form but none of the fresher techies filled it in. He reports that anecdotally they all seemed happy, and many have continued to do more shows. Ellie Cole says that all of the actors were happy and many have been cast in more things. Sammie Ruston says that there was still quite a big gap between the techies and the actors, and next year's committee should brainstorm how to further address this. Milly Parker says that something we did well was creating a better connection between the Playroom show and the ADC shows. The event with the prod teams went well, and should be done again next year. There should have been more advance planning of which committee members could help out over the get-in weekend.

6. Edinburgh Show Selection

Oscar Yang explains that last applications opened mid-February, but we should do this earlier this year to give people more time to apply. It takes place during normal show selection so we should open earlier to give people more time. We should add more things into the application guide so people understand the differences of Edinburgh shows. Carine Valarché suggests a talk. Sophie Taylor will organise something.

Action point: Sophie Taylor to organise this by February 4th.

The panel will be comprised of the incoming president, Andrew Tan, and two other members of the committee.

7. Presidential Election

The presidential election has to happen before Edinburgh show selection. Oscar Yang asks anyone who would want to run to send him a manifesto by the 24th of January. We will have hustings at the committee meeting on the 28th. Finalists can run if they are applying for a Masters but have to bear in mind the possibility of them not getting onto the Masters.

8. Constitutional Review

The constitutional review is happening on Wednesday, 17th January. The committee will have a chance to challenge changes we have made at the committee meeting on the 21st. After this the changes will be sent to the members of the club. If anyone challenges a change we've made, we will hold a Special General Meeting.

9. Partial Accounts and Club Show Budgets

Andrew Tan presents partial accounts and Club Shows Budgets.

Edinburgh shows usually lose us quite a lot of money. Charlotte Stephenson says that more guidance on venues is needed. One of the reasons *A Sudden Burst of Blinding* Light lost money is the venue was far too large and Gilded Balloon did not cater to their target audience.

We agree to close the props store completely, and give shows plenty of warning that they will have to get props for next term and Edinburgh by the end of this term.
